There are sessions of interest that run the gamut from novice to expert. Everyone can learn something to expand their capabilities. Examine the descriptions and the dates, and make your selections ASAP. Sessions can vary in length: either half day, full day, or two-day events, depending on the instructor and student needs. The workshop sessions start on April 12th and end on May 18th.

HANDS-ON-WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

(EVENT 1) Natural Edge Bowl Turning

Learn how to select, mount, and cut a natural edge bowl. Intermediate level of tooling and cutting skills (for safety) is required. Offerings: 3-hour sessions, weekdays only, scheduled at mutually convenient times.

1 Student per session, 2 Half-day sessions, \$20

(EVENT 2) Small Turning Projects

The easiest thing to turn when you first start out is a small turning. This could be a candlestick holder, a paperweight, a salt and peppershaker, a small bowl, a tea light or any number of other things. Schedule during the week, after April 15th, but before the 30th.

(EVENT 3) Coring

Preparing the blank, use of coring tools, and completion of nested bowls. Intermediate to advanced level session. April 19 and 20 are reserved plus two additional weekdays. Tradeoffs between weekends and weekdays are OK.

(EVENT 4) Making a friction fit box

Learn all the steps to successfully make a box. Once you have turned the basic box, we will focus on design, details and decoration to take it to the next level. Intermediate to advanced level session.

2 sessions in the same day. Saturday or Sunday except for the following: April 11 & 12, May 3 and May 10th

(EVENT 5) Make a Segmented Hollow Form

From mitering dry lumber to glue up to turning and finishing a segmented hollow form. Beginner to intermediate level session. Scheduled for Fridays and Saturdays.

(EVENT 6) Segmented Turning

Learn how it's done directly from the master. Make an open segmented vase for your first lesson, and then go from there on your own, as far as your imagination takes you.

(EVENT 7) Bandsaw / Lathe Turned Vessels

Making segmented bandsaw/lathe turned vessels starting with a layout, cutting out on a bandsaw and finishing on the lathe. Beginner to intermediate level session. Scheduled for Saturdays and Sundays.

1 Student per session, 2 Half-day sessions, \$20

(EVENT 8) Intermediate Hollow Form Turning

Session will include: wood selection and orientation; what constitutes a pleasing vessel form; shaping and hollowing techniques; bottom removal and finishing. Intermediate to advanced level session.

Derry & Monster hollowing tools will be used. Scheduled for Saturdays and Sundays.

(EVENT 9) Hollow Form Turning

Learn the basic principals of Tai Chi to maneuver the tools with your body to shape and hollow out a form while using both Ellsworth & Monster Tools. Schedule Mondays only 3/28, 4/5, 4/12 & 4/19

(EVENT 10) Turning a Peppermill

Students will design, turn and fully assemble an 8" to 12" peppermill, taking the completed project with them when they leave. There will be a \$25 material fee. A stainless steel grind mechanism will be provided as well as a blank, though participants can bring their own blank (3" X at least 10") if they like. Schedule is flexible.

2 Students per session, 2 Half-Day sessions, \$20

(EVENT 11) Log to Lathe for beginners

Chainsaw the log, bandsaw the blank, blank orientation on the lathe, grain balance, how to hold the blank on the lathe and the student roughs the blank. Schedule is flexible.

2 Students per session, 2 Half-Day sessions, \$20

3. Next preference will be given to non-members, who must include payment for Year 2008 Membership (\$30) in the DelVal Woodturners Club with this Registration Application.

Registration, with payment, is due by March 1st, 2008. Please mail your Registration Application as early as possible, with a check made out to "DelVal WOODTURNERS" for the full amount of the donations for the chosen events, to Andy DiPietro at address below. Moneys will be returned for those events for which your application has not been accepted, due to prior full enrollment.

You will be contacted by the instructor of each event you are registered for, and you will be given driving directions, if necessary, and advised of the need for you to bring any items such as tools, material, etc. If you are attending a full day event, you will be advised of plans for lunch.
